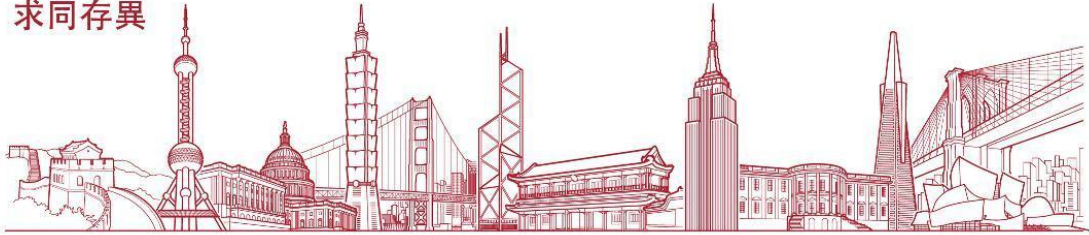

China's challenges in developing a reform agenda are clear. The global economy is beset by malaise, and domestic issues ranging from environmental degradation, growing inequality, corruption, and a lack of trust are growing ever more pressing. China will have to restructure its economy, moving from export-led growth to domestically driven growth, and it will have to redefine the role of government. At the same time, China's impressive record of pulling millions from poverty in the last decades shows it has the capacity to make changes on a grand scale. In this keynote, Columbia University professor and Nobel laureate Joseph E. Stiglitz charts a path for China's future, explaining the policy priorities that will be necessary to move the country forward. He explains how the US can play a more constructive role in encouraging and facilitating these reforms.

In June 2013, President Obama met with China's President Xi Jinping for a uniquely informal two-day summit at the Sunnylands Estate in California. Presidents Obama and Xi both conveyed clear messages to signal their strategic priorities – Xi touted a new type of major power relationship between both countries, and Obama focused on pivot toward Asia. Ethnic Chinese continue to be the focus of criminal investigations and prosecutions involving national security, intellectual property theft, and export control violations. Speakers highlight the requirements and risks these laws pose, including the dangers of racial profiling, and assess implications for U.S.-China relations.

Although Asian American representation in Silicon Valley's high-tech workforce has grown from 38 percent in 2000 to over 50 percent in 2010, only 11 percent of senior executives are Asian American. Speakers discuss the impact of Asian Americans' ideas, innovation and identity on high-tech sectors and identify the challenges they face in achieving leadership positions and leading their companies.
