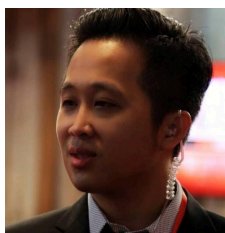




Angie Bao

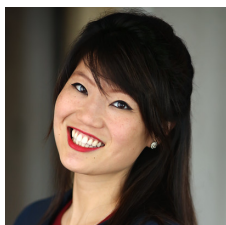


Dictson Fu

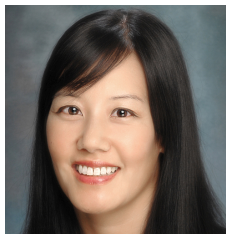

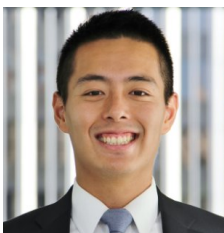

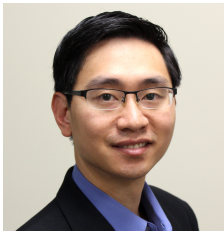


Kenan Jiang

Co-founder, Homeier & Law, P.C

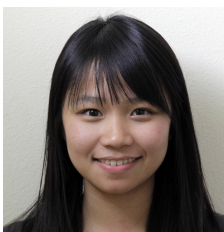

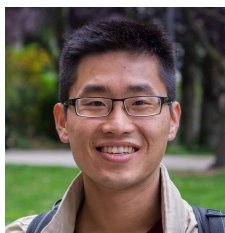


Peter J. Liang

Serena Lin

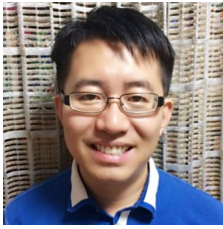
Television producer /Miss Chinese American DC 2010

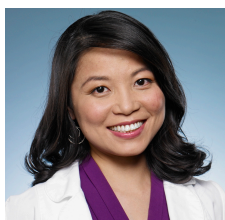


Stephany Xu (Zoo)

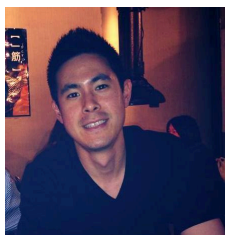

Teaching Assistant, UCLA School of Theater, Film & Television

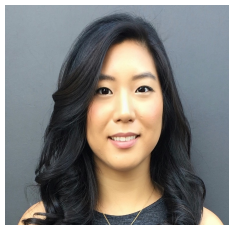
